Extract from the press release Galerie Reinhold Maas, Reutlingen and media artist Wolf Nkole Helzle, Mehrstetten announce their collaboration.

The two-pronged start to this collaboration is extremely remarkable: a first collection from Wolf Nkole Helzle's "FLOWERS" series will be published via the NFT platform opensea. With this launch, the media artist is entering the NFT space for the first time. At the same time, pictures will be physically on display in the Reutlingen gallery.

"On 10 November 2023, we are launching a first NFT series by the artist on opensea and are convinced that his work has found an additional, great form of expression in the NFT. This form of expression will make his art present and relevant worldwide. All of his previous series are perfect for realisation as NFTs. We will start with the series "FLOWERS" described above by publishing a triad; each plant both as a single image, then animated, rotating, and also photographed from many different perspectives and then layered into one image (photographic condensation).

We are convinced that we are giving the "NFT art world" an

unstoppable boost by bringing a digital art form that has been developed over thirty years to where it can develop its power in the digital space in addition to its physical presence."

Reinhold Maas is happy to help interested parties get started in the world of NFTs.

He was delighted that one of the stops was Rappertshofen and that the people from here are now also part of the overall project.

Invitation: The picture, which will be unveiled on 25 November 2023 at 1.30 pm as part of this year's Advent market, shows all 115 people that Helzle was able to photograph on Rappertshofen Day in the RT-Nord cultural park. He then transparently layered all of these individual portraits on top of each other using specially developed software, resulting in a face that contains each individual in equal measure.
